Dear brothers and sisters in Christ.

Today, let me pose this question: Is your faith motivated more by fear or by hope? Does your faith make you more aware of what you can't do, or of what you can do through God's grace? That's the difference between little faith and great faith.


But here is the good news. Jesus can work with both. When Peter and the disciples are scared to death by a storm, Jesus reprimands them for having little faith, but he still intervenes to save them. And when the disciples think there is not enough bread for everyone who needs it, Jesus gives them the gears for their lack of faith but he supplies them anyway. So even when the disciples seem to have little faith, it is not zero faith. They may turn to Jesus out of fear, but at least they turn to Jesus, and in every case Jesus comes through for them.

Someone once said: "Courage is fear that has said its prayers." For our purposes here today, let it be known that great faith is little faith that has said its prayers. Great faith is little faith that is still praying, still trying, still open to what God can do in our lives. The failure of healing in your life is not a sign that your prayers lack faith; it is a sign that you need to keep praying. That's because the ability to keep praying, the ability to keep trying, the ability to keep making yourself available for God's use, is precisely what makes faith great.

Many thanks to Fr. Gregory for his service to our pastoral district these past few weeks. Please continue to pray for him and his important ministry in our Eparchy – I know that he prays for us!

I'm looking forward to returning this week in time to celebrate the Feast of the Dormition of the Mother of God – this Tuesday, August 15th. This feast, which is also sometimes called the Assumption, commemorates the death, resurrection and glorification of Christ's mother. It proclaims that Mary has been "assumed" by God into the heavenly kingdom of Christ in the fullness of her spiritual and bodily existence. It is the custom in our Ukrainian Catholic Church to bless flowers on this Feast. Make every effort to attend the Feast Day Liturgy this Tuesday at 5:00PM, and bring flowers for blessing and sharing!
