

Perhaps you cannot anticipate the future or enjoy the present because you are imprisoned by the pain of your past!



Brothers and sisters, there are times when you need to let go of all that heartbreak and forgive the past. Now, if you don't like the word forgive for this, use another phrase like "let go" or "break free"; but allow yourself to be free from the past hurt and pain that has gone on without reconciliation.

One way we can forgive is by praying for the person. The practice of requesting a Divine Liturgy intention for loved ones - living or deceased - is a beautiful and wonderful part of our Catholic tradition.
