The Catholic Bishops of Saskatchewan would like to recognize Thursday, May 25, 2017 as World Catholic Education Day. On this day Catholics across the globe give thanks for the gift of Catholic Education, and we joyfully celebrate the unique identity and distinctive contributions of Catholic Education in the lives of people around the world. This year, the theme for World Catholic Education Day is "And You Will See Me".




