for I am meek and humble of heart;


and you will find rest for yourselves.

"The future of the world passes through the family" St. John Paul II, Familiaris *Consortio*, 79

**Holiness:** "Holy this moment, joyous voices ringing..." is a traditional Ukrainian hymn which is very familiar to most of us. Holiness is however, something many of us think about only in the context of church and not as personally applicable to our daily

lives. Nothing could be further from the truth. Pope Francis, in his exhortation *Gaudete et exsultate* reminds us that God calls all to holiness. Matthew Kelly, in his recent book, *The Biggest Lie in the History of Christianity*, (p. 50-52) suggests that a denial of our capacity for achieving holiness robs us of our ability to access the transforming power of God to be the best version of ourselves that we can be. He says if we want to be truly happy we MUST seek holiness. One way we can begin to do that, Kelly teaches, is by integrating **holy moments** into our everyday lives…here are some suggestions on where to start:

- 1. Begin each day with a short prayer of gratitude for another day. Remember all LIFE is a gift from God even when we face challenges and difficulties.
- 2. Go out of your way to do something for your spouse that you would rather not do as an intentional act of love.
- 3. Offer the least enjoyable task of your day as a prayer for someone who is suffering.
- 4. Control your temper, even if you are justified in losing it. Stay calm in the midst of crisis.

- 5. Before making **any** decision ask yourself if it will make you a better version of yourself. Choose the best version of yourself even if you don't feel like it.
- 6. Encourage, coach, praise or affirm someone. We all need more of those positives.
- 7. Be patient with someone who drives you crazy.
- 8. Do someone else's chores.
- 9. Offer to pray with someone, rather than just for them. In that you help them learn how to pray, and give your active support in taking the first step.
- 10. Make a healthy food/drink choice.
- 11. Reduce, Reuse and Recycle—they are Ukrainian traditions that will make your Baba proud and show that you care for God's creation.
- 12. Get honest with yourself about your self-destructive habits. (Monthly sacramental confession is great place to start to work on these issues—we all have them.)
- 13. Tell God you trust he has a great plan for you and your life. (Jer. 29:11)
- 14. Give whoever is in front of you, your full attention.
- 15. Tell someone your faith story, share a life changing book or your experience of the blessings of wholeheartedly following Christ.

Holiness is possible! "This is the will of God, that you be holy!"

1 Thess. 4:3 "We sing of wondrous blessings, our cup is overflowing, our song (and lives) will tell the world that Jesus is love..." May our lives be filled with many holy moments.
