

Bishop Bryan J. Bayda, CSsR, Appointed as New Apostolic Administrator of the Eparchy of Toronto & Eastern Canada

On Saturday, November 9, 2019, His Holiness Pope Francis appointed the Most Reverend Bryan Bayda CSsR, as Apostolic Administrator sede vacante of the Ukrainian Catholic Eparchy of Toronto and Eastern Canada while remaining Bishop of the Ukrainian Catholic Eparchy Saskatoon.



The Holy Father has accepted the resignation from the pastoral care of the eparchy of Toronto of the Ukrainians, presented by **Bishop Stephen Victor Chmilar D.D.**.

The <u>Ukrainian Catholic Eparchy of Toronto and Eastern Canada</u> has 55 parishes and missions, with a Catholic population of 23,700 served by 62 diocesan priests, three priests and 18 Sisters who are members of institutes of consecrated life, as well as 16 permanent deacons.



The <u>Ukrainian Catholic Eparchy Saskatoon</u> has 69 parishes and missions, with a Catholic population of 5,800 served by 19 diocesan priests, seven priests and 15 Sisters who are members of institutes of consecrated life, as well as three permanent deacons.
