Brothers and sisters in Christ,

Christ is Risen! Indeed, He is Risen! Xpuctoc Bockpec! Boïctuhy Bockpec!

To all moms in our parish community: Happy Mother's Day! A special note of gratitude to **Marcie Lalach** who helped to give me life!

I'm not sure about you, but these past few months have given me plenty of time for reflection – time to think about what is happening now and how we might navigate the future, especially as a parish community. On other occasions, I think about the past – decisions I've made, experiences and encounters that I've had. The good ones are easy to accept, but the bad ones – not so much!

Does your past ever haunt you? The Samaritan Woman in today's Gospel (click <a href="here">here</a> for the liturgical propers) was someone with a checkered history, but she encountered Good News because Jesus was more interested in her future than her past. He wanted to satisfy her thirst more than judge her history. Jesus looks beyond her past and sees a woman dying of thirst; a woman thirsting to be loved, to be seen, to be accepted, to be included, to be forgiven, to be known. Her thirst would never be quenched by the external wells of life. Nor will ours. Until we come to the well of Christ's life within us, we will continue returning to the dry wells of our life.

One way we can draw upon this 'water of immortality' is the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Our current pandemic has unfortunately made it very difficult to celebrate in the usual way: face-to-face or in the confessional. Although these same restrictions remain for confessions inside the church, fewer restrictions exist outdoors (especially now with warmer weather). As a result, going forward, I'll be available to celebrate **Reconciliation on Saturdays from IIAM-Noon** (beginning May 16<sup>th</sup>). Please be attentive to posted instructions and give the person in front of you plenty of space not just for social distancing but also confidentiality.

Thank-you to the many individuals who have offered Divine Liturgy intentions this past week! For your information, I am giving individuals who request a Liturgy intention (remember, it's not a 'mass') the option of attending Liturgy in-person in church (along with the members of their household) on the day it is scheduled. This practice is in line with the Eparchial directive of restricting the number of persons gathered in church to less than 10 persons while providing the opportunity to physically be present for prayer in our church building (which I know many of you miss very much).

Remember that I continue to pray for you and your family! We'll see you online - see below for this week's schedule.

- 4. **Virtual National March for Life** from May 10-15: Given the present COVID-19 pandemic restrictions, Canadian organizers have announced the first-ever Virtual March for Life: a weeklong, online program building up to the day of the 23rd National March for Life, which marks the May 14, 1969 passing of the infamous omnibus bill that opened the floodgates to abortion on demand in our country. The virtual March for Life initiative will also bring awareness to the killing occurring at the other end of the spectrum, near the end of life, with a focus on the proposed expansions to Canada's

euthanasia law. The March for Life virtual program will include films and interviews streamed online from May 10-12; a virtual candlelight vigil on Wednesday, May 13; online pro-life Masses and religious services on Thursday, May 14; and a livestreamed 'virtual' rally, with guests from Canada and around the world. Additionally, CLC Youth and Niagara Region Right to Life will host a pro-life webinar run exclusively by youth for youth on Friday, May 15, from 12:30 pm to 3:00 pm EDT (10:30 am to 1 pm in Saskatchewan). All events will be hosted online at marchforlife.ca and various March for Life social media platforms. Watch for updates.
