Glory to Jesus Christ!

**Trust.** Whether we realize it or not, life would be impossible without "trusting." The parable in today's Gospel has much to tell us about God. It shares about God's trust in human beings; God's trust in us. Our God is a God who trusts his workers. Just as the landowner gave the tenants a fully equipped vineyard in which to work and produce, God creates the possibilities for work, fruitfulness, and success for us too. He provides us with opportunities, resources and talents and trusts that we will make the most of these. Our own, personal vineyards are completely unique. Perhaps this is an important question to ask ourselves today, especially as another academic year begins and as we begin a new liturgical year (on September 1st): do we recognize the opportunities and resources and talents that God has given us? Have we responded responsibly, or have we taken our giftedness for granted? Today, let us open our hearts and our minds to fully understand God's Trust in us -- a Trust so strong that He become one of us, and continues to walk with us every step of the way.

As we head into the fall, the beginning of a new Church Year (this Tuesday) and the start of another school year (next Tuesday), not much has changed since the last one ended in June! Gatherings are limited; many activities postponed or cancelled. And yet, some group activities like hockey, Ukrainian dance, shopping and school are resuming - albeit with protocols and protective measures in place – but nevertheless a sign of hope for many. Much the same, inperson attendance at Divine Liturgy has resumed, and despite the added protocols and protective measures in place in our church, being back in church has been an experience of hope and peace for many. With that in mind, if you haven't been back in church since the start of this pandemic, I really encourage you and your family to make every effort to come back to church, *particularly* if you are resuming activities like team sports, group dance or shopping! Simply register online or call 306-652-4837 and leave a message indicating your name, the number of persons from your immediate household planning to attend, and the date and time you would like to attend. Remember that there is still no obligation for anyone to attend services in church, especially if you are medically vulnerable. If you are concerned about larger groups, you may want to consider attending a weekday Liturgy (see schedule that follows), where attendance is typically less than ten. And beginning on September 13<sup>th</sup>, Sunday Divine Liturgy will be celebrated at 9:30AM and 5:00PM, with attendance limited to 30 persons per liturgy.





We also familiarized ourselves with the verses from *Christus Vivit (Christ is Alive) – Apostolic Exhortation on Youth* 

and reflected on these verses in the light of the Bible passage. We will be continuing with our Bible/Scripture group but moving our sessions to Saturday mornings at 11:30 a.m. (Saskatoon time).


**Saskatoon CWL Clothing Depot Update:** The CWL Clothing Depot is open to receive donations of good used clothing and household items on Thursdays from 10 am to 2p.m. Please bring your donations to the back door of the Clothing Depot, which is located at 619-20th Street, Saskatoon. At this time there will NOT be weekly pick-up by the Clothing Depot driver. Watch for further information as we work towards opening the CWL Clothing Depot in a safe and timely manner.

**Sanctum** is a hospice and transitional care home in Saskatoon that provides around-the-clock transitional care for HIV positive persons who have social and high-risk behaviors and conditions, including homelessness, that prevent them from properly caring for themselves. **Sanctum 1.5** is an HIV pre-natal care home that supports high risk, HIV-positive pregnant women. The goal is to prevent the transmission of HIV to the unborn baby throughout pregnancy and at birth and to provide support in planning for the unborn baby though an integrated model of care. Since opening Sanctum 1.5 on Oct 2, 2018:

- 37 mothers have received care,
- 6 mothers are currently in the Sanctum 1.5 program,
- 21 children are with their mothers in the community,
- 9 children are with their kin,

• 24 additional children of mothers who have graduated the program have been returned to their mother's care. Since this year's "Sanctum Survivor" major fund-raising event was cancelled because of COVID-19, extra support is needed to continue these much-needed services.
