Glory to Jesus Christ!

Our Gospel for today from St. John should get us thinking about the feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross, which will be celebrated this Monday, September 14 (Divine Liturgy is at 6:30PM). It's an important feast in our liturgical year, so much so that there is both a Sunday before the Exaltation and a Sunday after the Exaltation. To "exalt" someone or something, means to raise them up, to lift our heads and look upwards at it. For us Christians, that's what happens when we look at the Cross. Each time we look at the Cross of Jesus we are reminded of his love for us, how he loved us to the very end. It is the cross to which we look for healing and for hope.

Speaking of hope, statistics are showing the COVID-19 pandemic is resulting in a spike in cases of depression and suicide. A recent <u>article</u> in Psychology Today suggests that there is potential for a post-pandemic suicide epidemic. If you find yourself losing hope, overwhelmed, depressed or suicidal, PLEASE DO NOT HESITATE TO CALL ME. Remember that you are never alone!

On a different level, please consider registering for the **Dying Healed Seminar**, which is being hosted by our parish on Monday September 21st and 28th, 6:30pm to 9:30pm each day. This workshop will provide you with a deep understanding of death and dying as it impacts our lives, relationships with others and God, and how it impacts our whole society. The presenters are Deborah Larmour (Eparchial Family and Life Office) and Jackie Saretsky (Pastoral Services Director for the Diocese of Saskatoon). **Registration is required** by going <u>online</u>, calling the parish office (306-652-4837), or emailing Jana Lalach at <u>imlalach@sasktel.net</u>.

Exaltation of the Holy Cross: A Family Tradition worth Revisiting...



In a world where no one understands suffering, the incredible beauty and victory of the Life-Giving Cross makes no sense whatsoever. As Christians, we know that the meaning of the Cross is that through it Christ defeated death, so it is the symbol of our salvation. However, the fact that the Cross of Christ has a profound impact on our daily life is often missed. All humanity is subject to suffering. But in Christ that pain is given meaning and hope. Scripture often talks about the paradox of our faith wherein joy can be borne from sorrow. As St. John Paul II reminds us, in his *Apostolic Letter on Human Suffering*, "In Christ's cross it is not only that the redemption is completed

through the passion; but human suffering is itself redeemed." Christ suffered for us out of Love, in this great love our suffering is linked to love, and in love, life and hope abound.

So proudly display the crucifix of Christ in your home and icon corners! Decorate it and venerate it on this feast (September 14). Everyone suffers, but because of our faith we are not alone. Christ is with us in all our suffering, He endures it with us and in the Cross of Christ the ultimate victory is found. Remind your children that all our suffering can have meaning as we can, in love, unite our sufferings with Christ's. "To your Cross, O Master, we bow in Veneration, and we Glorify Your Holy Resurrection!"

Saskatoon CWL Clothing Depot Update: The CWL Clothing Depot is open to receive donations of good used clothing and household items on Thursdays from 10 am to 2p.m. Please bring your donations to the back door of the Clothing Depot, which is located at 619-20th Street, Saskatoon. At this time there will NOT be weekly pick-up by the Clothing Depot driver. Watch for further information as we work towards opening the CWL Clothing Depot in a safe and timely manner.

The 40 Hours for Life campaign will be conducted Monday to Friday from 9 a.m. to 12 noon, starting Wednesday, Sept. 23 and running until Oct. 30 with prayer and witness offered along Queen Street in front of Saskatoon City Hospital. Signs are provided. Volunteers are needed to take one-hour shifts to pray for an end to abortion and to offer women a better choice. There are three one-hour time slots each day (Monday to Friday): 9 a.m. to 10 a.m.; 10 a.m. to 11 a.m.; and 11 a.m. to noon. Sanctum is a hospice and transitional care home in Saskatoon that provides around-the-clock transitional care for HIV positive persons who have social and high-risk behaviors and conditions, including homelessness, that prevent them from properly caring for themselves. **Sanctum 1.5** is an HIV pre-natal care home that supports high risk, HIV-positive pregnant women. The goal is to prevent the transmission of HIV to the unborn baby throughout pregnancy and at birth and to provide support in planning for the unborn baby though an integrated model of care. Since opening Sanctum 1.5 on Oct 2, 2018:

- 37 mothers have received care,
- 6 mothers are currently in the Sanctum 1.5 program,
- 21 children are with their mothers in the community,
- 9 children are with their kin,

• 24 additional children of mothers who have graduated the program have been returned to their mother's care. Since this year's "Sanctum Survivor" major fund-raising event was cancelled because of COVID-19, extra support is needed to continue these much-needed services.
