Glory to Jesus Christ!

Have you ever had the experience of shaking hands with someone and they were already looking for someone else before they let your hand drop, as if you were obstructing their view? I remember visiting a church on a vacation and as soon as the pastor found out that we were not prospective new members, he began to glance around the room as if I wasn't even there.

No one likes to be overlooked. Imagine being overlooked all the time because of what you look like - passed over for a job because you're not attractive enough, or you don't get the promotion you deserve because you are a woman, or no one will give you a chance because you are too old or too young. If you have been written off or overlooked when someone doesn't even know you or the content of your character, you can understand the plight of the Canaanite woman in today's Gospel. I imagine being overlooked is a way of life for her. Even in the Gospel lesson she does not get a name.

For a moment she is turned away by a great spiritual leader, which for many would feel like they were being turned away by God. That's why it is so hard when our feelings get hurt in church. We expect to experience the compassion and love of God when we come to church or approach a priest, and if we are hurt or overlooked for the moment, then it affects our core spirit. Where else will we find the sacred in our lives? This is what disturbs us in this Gospel Lesson. This story touches upon a fear that we might have ourselves: that maybe God finds us to be really annoying, that we don't belong, or that we don't deserve the bread, and others are more important.

And yet, this was a woman who understood the power of God's grace, a woman who believed so much that she knew a crumb from Jesus would suffice. This unnamed woman gives us a wonderful example of how to approach God with humility and confidence, deference and boldness, a grounded trust in God's love despite all the human obstacles that stand in the way of relationship.

We are also planning to create a video about Fr. Iwaszko's life in Canada, while the young people from Ukraine are working on a video about Father Iwaszko's life before his immigration to Canada. This is a joint Ukrainian Canadian Youth project.

These two videos, along with the published book, will be presented at a "Remembrance Day" celebration next summer in honour of Father Volodymyr Iwaszko.
