Glory to Jesus Christ!

St. Augustine, writing in the fourth century, said that the wedding garment referred to in today's Gospel is charity, or love. This week, as you live your life in Christ, put on love, and wear it well!

As we live our life, most of us don't really want to think about suffering and we find it even harder to address the issues of death and dying. We all know it is inevitable for all of us but most of us are not prepared for the world of Assisted Suicide and Euthanasia that we now live in. This makes it essential to have a deep understanding of death and dying as it impacts our lives, relationships with others and God, and how it impacts our whole society. These topics and more are addressed at the **Dying Healed Seminar**, which is being hosted by Dormition Parish on Monday September 21st and 28th, 6:30pm to 9:30pm each day. The presenters are Deborah Larmour (Eparchial Family and Life Office) and Jackie Saretsky (Pastoral Services Director for the Diocese of Saskatoon). **Registration is required** by going online, calling the parish office (306-652-4837), or emailing lana Lalach at imlalach@sasktel.net.

Beginning next Sunday, September 13th, Divine Liturgy will be celebrated at 9:30AM and 5:00PM at Dormition Parish, with attendance limited to 30 persons per liturgy. We continue to Livestream the Divine Liturgy on Sundays at 9:30AM and some weekdays. If you are concerned about larger groups, you may want to consider attending a weekday Liturgy (see schedule that follows), where attendance is typically less than ten.



The message asks if you are busy, ask for a favour, or directly ask for iTunes gift cards or funds. **Do NOT send gift cards, money, or cash transfers if requested to do so over e-mail or via text message.** If you receive messages asking for help like this from our bishops or priests, either contact their offices directly to check whether they are authentic, or just ignore. If you are the victim of fraud, contact your local police or RCMP office.

This summer we had an amazing group of girls and young women from Saskatoon and Sambir (Ukraine) who met every Thursday morning via "ZOOM" to glorify God and grow spiritually by reading the Holy Scripture, reflecting on God's Word and sharing experiences. We also familiarized ourselves with the verses from *Christus Vivit (Christ is Alive) – Apostolic Exhortation on Youth*

and reflected on these verses in the light of the Bible passage. We will be continuing with our Bible/Scripture group but moving our sessions to Saturday mornings at 11:30 a.m. (Saskatoon time).

Therefore, following the example of our Blessed Virgin Mary, who was constantly listening to God's Word and contemplating on it in her heart, we are inviting girls & young women (15-35 years of age) to join our Bible group every Saturday morning at 11:30 a.m. via ZOOM.

Saskatoon CWL Clothing Depot Update: The CWL Clothing Depot is open to receive donations of good used clothing and household items on Thursdays from 10 am to 2p.m. Please bring your donations to the back door of the Clothing Depot, which is located at 619-20th Street, Saskatoon. At this time there will NOT be weekly pick-up by the Clothing Depot driver. Watch for further information as we work towards opening the CWL Clothing Depot in a safe and timely manner.

Sanctum is a hospice and transitional care home in Saskatoon that provides around-the-clock transitional care for HIV positive persons who have social and high-risk behaviors and conditions, including homelessness, that prevent them from properly caring for themselves. **Sanctum 1.5** is an HIV pre-natal care home that supports high risk, HIV-positive pregnant women. The goal is to prevent the transmission of HIV to the unborn baby throughout pregnancy and at birth and to provide support in planning for the unborn baby though an integrated model of care. Since opening Sanctum 1.5 on Oct 2, 2018:

- 37 mothers have received care,
- 6 mothers are currently in the Sanctum 1.5 program,
- 21 children are with their mothers in the community,
- 9 children are with their kin,
- 24 additional children of mothers who have graduated the program have been returned to their mother's care. Since this year's "Sanctum Survivor" major fund-raising event was cancelled because of COVID-19, extra support is needed to continue these much-needed services.
