Mail-In Ballots for Catholic School Board Trustees

Civic elections are November 9. Eligible voters for Greater Saskatoon Catholic Schools' Board of Education may apply for a mail-in ballot. When your application is approved, a ballot will be mailed to the voter.

Apply to vote by mail using one of these four options:

- **Online**: Apply using the form below before October 30
- **By email**: Print, complete, and email the <u>voter registration form / mail-in ballot</u> application to elections@saskatoon.ca
- **In-person by appointment only**: Print, complete, and deliver the <u>voter registration form / mail-in ballot application</u>to the election office
- **By mail**: Request a mail-in ballot application be mailed to you by providing your name and mailing address to elections@saskatoon.caor 306-657-8683

Pandemic, but Make it Fashion: Ukrainian Embroidered PPE in the Time of COVID-19

Friday, October 16, 2020 12 Noon via ZOOM

Throughout times of uncertainty and crisis, we attempt to find comfort in the things we know to be true. For Ukrainians, this has been their identity. During the earliest days of COVID-19, a surge of embroidered Personal Protective Equipment became available. Utilized as a tool of de-Russification, the presence of embroidery not only evokes ancient Ukrainian beliefs and traditions of protection bestowed on the wearer, but it also acts as a bond between people, forming patterns of trust built on cultural connection, when faces are only partially visible. This talk explores embroidery in the post-maidan landscape of Ukraine, looking beyond the decorative elements of adorning ones' self with beautiful clothing. Instead, it looks at the ways people decorate themselves as a form of protest and for the sake of decolonization, even during the pressing times of pandemic.

Katya is a 2nd year MA Thesis student in the department of Modern Languages and Cultural Studies, pursuing her degree in Media and Cultural Studies. She has spent the last several months modifying her research to accommodate the new limitations and social occurrences of COVID-19. Through generous funding from grants, scholarships, and bursaries from KuFC, CIUS, the Shevchenko Foundation, and the MLCS, Katya has been able to conduct modified research by shifting her focus towards the presence of embroidery in the pandemic.
