Going meatless for Great Lenten? Try these Lenten Recipes!

Buckwheat Casserole

1 clove garlic, crushed
1 medium onion, chopped
1 tin mushrooms, drained
¹/₄ cup vegetable oil
2 cups whole buckwheat, rinsed
¹/₂ tsp. salt, pepper or other seasoning to taste
3 cups vegetable bouillon diluted in water Chopped parsley

Sauté onion and garlic in hot oil until onion is translucent. Stir in buckwheat and seasonings. Heat and stir about 3 minutes.
Add bouillon and mushrooms. Bring to a boil. Turn mixture into a greased casserole.
Cover and bake for 1 hour at 350° F. Garnish with parsley. Serves 6-7.

Kvass (Cold Cucumber Soup)

¹/₂ cup green onions or chives

tsp. salt
or 2 cucumbers, grated

or 2 potatoes, cooked and mashed

tbsp. lemon juice or vinegar
radishes

Dill weed (optional)

Vary ingredients according to preference. Slice some of the radishes for garnish; grate the rest. Combine ingredients with enough cold water to make the soup mixture. May be served with boiled cubed potatoes on the side. Adjust seasonings to taste.
